The regular bi-monthly meeting of the ASSC Executive Committee was held Saturday, March 7, 2020 at the SCDNR archaeology building. The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by President David Gordon. A quorum was present.

Officer Reports:

Secretary's Report- (Rebecca)

The minutes for the previous meetings were sent out recently and no corrections were received. A motion was made to approve the minutes and all were in favor.

Post Conference Membership Update:

We currently have 103 (non-lifetime) society members, and 51 lifetime members. This breaks down to 8 family memberships, 33 Individual, 35 Senior, 21 Senior Family, and 6 Student memberships.

Membership location demographics break down to 89 in South Carolina, 7 in North Carolina, 3 in Florida, 2 in Georgia, 1 in Arkansas, 1 in Tennessee, and 1 in Pennsylvania.

Our membership total for 2019 was 123, so we are down slightly from that. We received 48 membership renewals at the conference, which continues to be the most popular way to renew, followed by renewing through a chapter, which so far 41 members have done.

60 regular members and 4 lifetime members attended the conference.

The majority of our members are seniors and we need to work on better appealing to younger demographics. Possibly setting up tables at USC events like the Student Anthropology conference.

Possibility of a "light membership" was suggested. Would not include the journal but would get newsletter and access to events. Potentially a \$10 membership fee. We would have to amend the bylaws for this, will be tabled for now.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>- (Ashley)

Jodi has been paid for the conference. A total of \$618 was spent on the Conference. We received \$2,180 in donations for Grant in Aid
